Bwabwata National Park

We have moved our Nambwa Campsite to a new and exciting location further into the Bwabwata National Park and away from Nambwa Tented Lodge, creating a more exclusive and wilder setting.

Nambwa Campsite was built by the African Monarch Lodges' construction team, trained by Dusty Rodgers. This was our first project without him.

The chandeliers and mosaic art pieces were meticulously crafted by our team at The Sijwa Project.

We used the following recycled materials from our Sijwa Project, where waste materials from Nambwa Tented Lodge and Kazile Island Lodge are repurposed and recycled into beautiful artifacts, jewelry and decor pieces:

NAMBWA CAMPSITE (non-commissionable)

As Nambwa Campsite is in the heart of KAZA, the World's Largest Wildlife Conservation Area, it is without a doubt, wild camping in its truest form, with local and migrant wildlife wandering through the campsites.

The campsites boast tasteful art mosaic pieces and chandeliers which have been skillfully crafted by the team at The Sijwa Project. The structures have been built or enhanced using accents of recycled materials paying tribute to all that African Monarch Lodges inspires through its Sijwa Project.

All campsites are equipped with the following:

- · Large camping areas with ample shade;
- Kitchen with a Lapa offering extra shade or serves as a rain cover during our wetter months;
- · Double wash basins with hot water;
- Bathroom with double basin, vanity, shower, toilet, hot water fueled through a donkey boiler using 100% recycled carton fire bricks made at The Sijwa Project;
- Individual Solar Powered lights, a plug point for a car fridge and 2 USB charge points;
- WiFi connectivity at each campsite;
- Fire pit with a grid and concrete benches surrounded by soft white sand in which you can sink your feet into around the fire. There is ample space to add camping chairs around the fire.





RATES

Nambwa Campsite offers 4 exclusive sites nestled under either a majestic Jackleberry, Strangler Fig, Leadwood or Knobthorn tree right behind the Kwando Rivers' Long Lagoon.

Each campsite has an expansive view of the vast floodplains beyond with an abundance of animals roaming these plains. 2 of the 4 campsites are more secluded and are located closer to the floodplains. Campsite 3 and 4 would be perfect for larger families or groups travelling together.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

- Children under the age of 12 years 50% of the per person sharing rate.
- The campsites are limited to 6 pax per campsite.
- Rate inclusions Campsite
- Rate exclusions park fees, sustainability levy and firewood.
- Pilot/Guide Complimentary when travelling with 6 or more clients.
- Rates are subject to change.
- Full payment is required 30 days prior to arrival to confirm any reservation. Should payment not be received 30 days prior to arrival the reservation will automatically be released.
- · For all reservations cancelled between:
- 29 and 15 days prior to arrival 75 % of the total amount will be due;
- 14 and 0 days prior to arrival 100 % of the total amount will be due.





DIRECTIONS

From Windhoek (blue line on map)

- Nambwa Campsite is located approximately 1114km northeast of Windhoek.
- To reach the campsite, visitors take the B1 from Windhoek to and until Otavi.
- At Otavi, turn right on the B10 and go northeast until Rundu.
- At Rundu, go east on the B8 for 200km crossing the Okavango River at Divundu. Pass through a police checkpoint. From the Divundu checkpoint drive 194km to the Park Reception Sign board on the left. Turn right at the dirt road leading to the Park Reception.
- 4x4 vehicles are required for the last 14km to Nambwa Campsite.
- Once you have passed through the park reception gate, follow the green concrete direction triangles on which you will see Nambwa Lodge stenciled. Follow the road until you reach the Nambwa Campsite sign at a fork in the road with Nambwa Tented Lodge visible at this point.
- Turn right at this fork and follow this road. Do not turn off the road until you reach Long Lagoon with its hide, ahead of you. Here, turn left at the Nambwa Campsite sign and follow the road until you reach the campsite reception.

From Katima Mulilo (green line on map)

- Nambwa Campsite is located approximately 144km west of Katima Mulilo;
- · To reach the campsite, visitors take the B1 from Katima Mulilo towards Rundu;
- At Kongola continue on the B1;
- · Pass through a police checkpoint and cross the bridge;
- · Look out for the Park Reception Sign board on the right. Turn left at the dirt road leading to the Park Reception;
- 4x4 vehicles are required for the last 14km to Nambwa Campsite;
- Once you have passed through the park reception gate, follow the green concrete direction triangles on which you will see Nambwa Lodge stenciled. Follow the road until you reach the Nambwa Campsite sign at a fork in the road with Nambwa Tented Lodge visible at this point;
- Turn right at this fork and follow this road. Do not turn off the road until you reach Long Lagoon and its hide, ahead of you. Here, turn left at the Nambwa Campsite sign.
